Learning about Community Projects for Local Disaster Prevention

Creating the future of the city together with the local community based on diverse perspectives

As part of our efforts to connect research on regional disaster prevention and mitigation initiatives in Shizuoka Prefecture and Shizuoka City to future community development, we collaborated with 13 companies and organizations* and carried out various activities. A total of 60 teams, each consisting of four people, worked together to conduct research on disaster prevention and mitigation with their partners, conducting learning activities aimed at contributing to the local community.

We based our activities on assessing the situation, formulating hypotheses, and developing plans on 'what high school students can do.' Each group shared their findings and insights from these activities with their partners and the local community during three reporting sessions.
